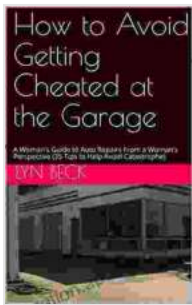

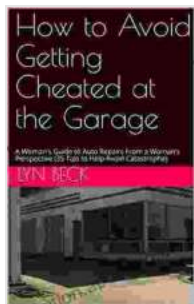
6. Pay Attention to Your Bill

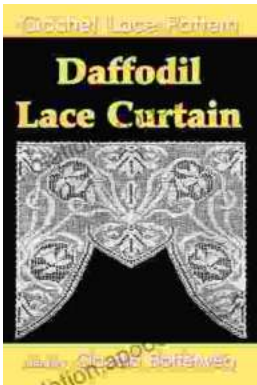
